Fieldwork - summer 2008

At Woodland Avenue we have excavated two test pits and recovered a number of microliths dating from the Mesolithic period. For many years the owner, Arthur Summerfield, has been keeping the flints and other artefacts he has been finding in the flower beds. We hope to do further work at the site over the coming weeks.

In addition we have excavated a test pit at 61 Woburn Road, Heath and Reach. This relatively small pit took much longer to excavate because of the rather inclement weather of late. On the last day it started to rain but we completed the pit thanks to the owner, Jon Fleming, providing a wonderful gazebo. The finds from the pit include coarse Medieval pottery which included a rim and part of a rod flagon handle. In addition we had a small piece of the lead channelling from a leaded window, a small copper object and a small piece of bronze.
