Summary of Past Events

Films of Leighton Buzzard - Colin Holmes - 17th September 2008

This event was a great succes with over 120 people attending; many of them being non-members. Colin showed films of life in Leighton Buzzard and Linslade in the 1960s. This included the canal, the sand industry, the cattle market as well as a day in the life of Leopold School.

"I've come about the drains" - Tony Rook - 8th October 2008

An amusing talk about Roman Baths by the man who excavated and preserved the Welwyn bathhouse. It included an account of Roman architecture in general.

Medieval Mayhem - Living History Day - 11th October

Once again the Society put on a display for this event. We had two boards of pictures with a Medieval theme but it was the two boards of 19th century "can you tell us where these were taken?" which stole the show.

Heath and Reach, what we know so far - 25th October 2008 at 2pm

This was a successful afternoon at the Heath Barn. We put on a display of maps and sale notices as well as showing the DVD of our excavation and having talks about the pubs and 1851 census. We launched our book of the early Heath and Reach wills.

Fieldwork - 2008

Work continued at Woodland Avenue where a 2 metre square test pit was excavated in the lawn where we believed there had been little disturbance. We recovered more microliths dating from the Mesolithic period but regretably no features. A report will appear in the next Transactions.
