Sept 14, 2011 The Tom Lawson Legacy. When local historian Tom Lawson died he left a large collection of his illustrated local history talks to Maureen Brown for the use of the Society. Oct 12, 2011 Historic Mills of Leighton Buzzard - Chris Mesley. The milling of corn was an essential part of our local economy over hundreds of years but there are very few visible remains of the industry. This talk will examine what we know of Leighton Buzzard's historic mills from a variety of sources and explore them in the context of the other watermills in the Ouzel valley. Where were Leighton's windmills and why were there so many? Who were the millers and what was the role of the millwrights? Why did our mills disappear? Is there enough information to construct a history of milling in the town? All of these questions and more will be the subject of this well-illustrated talk.

Nov 9, 2011 A Victorian Magic Lantern Show. This is a light-hearted fast moving show given by Tony Brown, an expert from 'A Touch of Glass'. An original 1890 lantern, modified to run on electricity, will be used to project the slides. We will see an assortment of the type of show and the different types of slides that would have been used at the time e.g. comic sets, black and white photographic slides, moving slides of several types, advertising slides etc. The demonstration will last from 50 to 55 minutes after which questions will be welcomed.
